CPR CERTIFICATION CANCELLED

Hypothermia Training

US Coast Guard Auxiliary Instructors will explain the effects of hyperthermia & first aid for hyperthermia. Scouts are timed to see how many screws & bolts they can put together in hypothermic water conditions.



Law Enforcement Boat Patrol Procedures

Scouts attend a lecture period with Texas Parks & Wildlife Department Wardens, Oklahoma Lake Patrol Troopers & US Army Corps of Engineers Rangers. Instructors discuss how Federal & Local laws are enforced on the water, & display equipment used by law enforcement. Scouts will ride in boats used by the officers & learn safe, patrol & boarding techniques with instructors.

Pipe Patching-Damage Control Training

with the United States Coast Guard

USCG Instructors will teach scouts the three main objectives of Damage Control. 1. Take action before damage occurs, 2. reduce damage by control flooding, 3. provide emergency repairs and restore services after damage occurs, using pipe patching techniques on a US Coast Guard damage control simulator.



Pumps-Dewatering

US Coast Guard Auxiliary Instructors demonstrate the use of a dewatering pump. Scouts test their skills by attempting to dewater a drum faster than the pump.



Signal device and Flare Training

US Coast Guard Auxiliary Instructors explain & demonstrate different types of flares & water signal devices. Scouts will have the opportunity to ignite flares in a safe and controlled environment.

Man Overboard Recovery

Life Saving & Response

Scouts attend a lecture period with Professional Firefighters that have been trained in rapid water response and water life saving and recovery. Scouts have the opportunity to have hands on training in a controlled environment. Scouts will ride on the rescue boats and practice man overboard recovery techniques with the instructors.



Flash pan & Fire Extinguisher Training

Professional Firefighters teach scouts the "PASS" pull, aim, squeeze and sweep technique, using live fire extinguishers on a real fire pit.



Fire Hose Handling & Training

Professional Fire fighters teach scouts the basics of hose handling. A fender set on a pulley system allows scout teams to aim a fire hose, pushing the fender to the opposite side.

BOARDING MANUAL: Once we receive your registration information, payment and list of attendees, you will receive from the registrar, detailed course description, equipment list, event locations & maps, waivers to be signed by guardian, check list of paperwork needed, locations for lodging including local campgrounds, hotels and cabins. It will be the responsibility of each unit to arrange the lodging or camping accommodations for your unit. **CODE OF CONDUCT:** The code of conduct is based on the principles of the Scout Law, Scout Oath, Sea Promise, Venturing Code and common courtesy. We are guests on United States Corps of Engineer property. Youth or adults who engage in un-Scout-like conduct will cause themselves or their Ship to be removed from the event. **UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS:** The Sea Scout youth participants shall wear Sea Scout class B working blues, or unit ship T-Shirts. Navy blue pants or Navy blue cargo shorts are required to be worn with Class B shirt or t-shirt. Ventures shall wear the venturing uniform. No sandals or open toed shoes. Participants will get wet at many of the stations, so having a dry change of clothing and towels are a necessity. Adults are asked to wear the adult khaki uniform or Venturing uniform. Jewelry such as necklaces, bracelets, and rings present a safety hazard at some of the stations, therefore will be required to be removed and will be avoided. No Civilian clothes or bathing suits will be permitted. Adult and Youth Class A Sea Scout uniforms shall be worn for the ban-
